

## BINGO Card Activity Key

- **Cornell Notes** - read over your notes, and re-write them while highlighting the key points. Then write a summary statement at the bottom. There are LOTS of resources online for how to do this!
- **Create-A-Quiz** - Using your notes, create a practice assessment & answer key. Remember, a couple selected response (multiple choice, true/false, etc) are OK, but they should be mostly modeling, constructed response, CER, etc.
- **Create Youtube Playlist** - Search Youtube for videos about the topic you're studying. Stick to short clips done by teachers, universities, or tutoring sites. Create and name your playlist on Youtube, and write questions that can be answered by watching the playlist.
- **Draw a Picture** - This can be a cartoon or comic book style drawing, or just a series of images that explains a concept. Stick figures are OK! You don't need to be an artist!
- **Elaborative Interrogation** - You'll need a partner for this. Your partner starts by asking you a question about the content and you explain the answer. Your partner follows up with "why?" or "how?" questions, and you continue to explain to the best of your ability. When you get stuck, write down the question that stumped you, and find the answer in your INB or online from a reputable website!
- **Flashcards** - create flashcards on index cards or notebook paper using the key vocabulary or ideas from the content.
- **Kahoot** - Search for a related Kahoot game to play OR create your own Kahoot to help you study!
- **Make a Model** - use your modeling skills to model one of the concepts you are studying. Draw a picture OR find one online to use as your background. Be sure to include linking statements/explanations!
- **Make a Game** - create a game based on the content.
- **Make a Presentation** - to teach a concept to a family member or peer
- **Quizlet** - use the Quizlet created by your teacher OR create your own to practice!
- **Quizzed by a friend/family member** - Using your INB, your friend/family member quizzes you about the content you are learning, and keeps track of which questions stump you!
- **Read an Article** - find an article on a reputable website about the content you're learning. Read and highlight any new information you learn from the article.
- **Read notes aloud** - either to yourself or a friend/family member
- **Review Notes & Write Summary** - read over your notes and write a summary. Try to cut your notes in  $\frac{1}{2}$  - if your notes are 4 paragraphs, your summary should be 2.
- **Sketchnotes** - recreate your notes using pictures, different fonts, different size or color text, symbols, etc to create emphasis on important points and help you remember the information in a creative new way. There are lots of examples of Sketchnotes online too!
- **Teach a Family Member/Friend** - Create a lesson about the topic and teach a friend/family member, be sure to check their understanding to make sure they are getting it!
- **Tweet it Out** - Pick the 5-8 most important things you've learned and write a Tweet about each of them (does NOT have to be on Twitter, can just be on paper). Remember, Tweets are limited to 140 characters - including spaces & punctuation!

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
